I want to encourage you all to read two important books, <u>Hiroshima</u>, by John Hersey, 1946, and <u>Nagasaki</u>, by Susan Southard, 2015. Both of these books are personal stories of hibakusha, survivors of the two bombings. While Hersey interviewed the Hiroshima survivors directly after the attack, Southard's subjects were reliving the Nagasaki experience decades later. The two narratives are complementary, and both provide human context and perspective on horrific life shattering events of which today's Americans have no experience or even the vaguest comprehension. If you want to borrow a copy of either, or both, I have them. Please ask. If you want to buy them and pass them on to friends after reading them, even better. Both are widely available, <u>Hiroshima</u> in many used book venues. Most libraries also have them.

This year's annual Hiroshima remembrance ceremony <u>Hiroshima to Hope</u> is again at Green Lake Park in Seattle, Tuesday August 6, beginning at 6 PM. I regret being unable to attend this year, but hope we can develop something local for next year. If you can make it, it is a powerfully moving experience.



The news media are full of **election chatter** these days, and it is clear from the first two rounds of Democrat presidential primary debates that nuclear war is not a high priority topic for any of them. Most likely that is because they and their funding sources have not yet noticed any substantial interest in the subject expressed by us, the electorate.
