**Status report: UN Treaty to ban nuclear weapons** As of July 25, 60 nations have signed, and 14 of them have ratified the treaty. Still a long way to go, but support continues to grow among the global community. **ICAN** just conducted a series of polls among our allies in Europe. 65% of respondents in Belgium, Germany, Italy, and the Netherlands want their governments to send back all US nuclear weapons stationed in their countries, and 69% want their countries to sign the UN Treaty Prohibiting Nuclear Weapons, worldwide.

**2019 Nuclear Weapons Budgets passed by Congress** As expected, spending on all phases of nuclear weapons projects, in both Defense and Energy Departments, has increased again, with one exception: nonproliferation programs, including New START extension, has gone down. Totals in Defense are \$21 Billion, and Energy \$15 Billion. (Nuclear weapons now account for half the Energy Department budget.)
