MARCH AND RALLY IN SEATTLE

Saturday, September 24, gather at noon

Citizens for the Universal Abolition of Nuclear Weapons is organizing a March & Rally calling for the Universal Abolition of Nuclear Weapons in Seattle. The march will assemble at Cal Anderson Park on Capitol Hill at Noon and will march to the Henry M. Jackson Federal Building for a rally. David Swanson is the keynote speaker.

The organizers hope a large crowd will attend to send a strong message to politicians and the general public that the people of Western Washington demand the elimination of nuclear weapons and the threat they represent to life on earth.

AUGUST ACTIVITIES AROUND THE STATE

GROUND ZERO CENTER PROTESTS AND 77th ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATION Approximately 40 people were present on August 8th at a flash mob demonstration against Trident Nuclear Weapons at the Bangor submarine base. The demonstration was in the



roadway and blocked traffic entering the Main Gate of the Trident Nuclear Submarine Base during rush hour traffic. Thirteen demonstrators were detained and cited by authorities. Watch a video of the flash mob <u>HERE</u>.

Naval Base Kitsap-Bangor is homeport to the largest concentration of deployed nuclear warheads in the U.S. The warheads are deployed on missiles on eight Trident SSBN submarines and in an underground nuclear weapons storage facility on the base. (NOTE: One Trident submarine carries the destructive force of over 1,200 Hiroshima bombs.)

The walk is coordinated by Rev. Senji Kanaeda of the <u>Nipponzan Myohoji Buddhist Temple</u> on Bainbridge Island. The Nipponzan Myohoji order was founded in 1917 and actively engages in the peace movement worldwide by organizing walks for nuclear disarmament and human rights.
